TEAP Study results- Dakin Schultz

The council along with Mr. Schultz reviewed information on the TEAP Study. Part of the study reported short term recommendations to include replacing existing signs, updating intersection pavement markings, adopting the use of ladder style crosswalks, utilizing trained crossing guard, and relocate existing school advance crossing. The other part of the study was identified as long-term recommendations. The biggest change would be to convert US Hwy 71 to a 3-lane road with left hand turning lane to address safety issue, ADA improvements to sidewalks/curb ramps, replace traffic and ped signal equipment, install emergency vehicle warning at the intersection of 19th St., install pedestrian signal at US 71 & IA 86, and improve turning radius at US 71 & 13th St. There was discussion on different funding options and the possibility of cost sharing with the DOT if that's what the council chooses to do. It was recommended that the infrastructure committee meet and bring suggestions to the council at a later date.

Council to hear from John Wills with Dickinson County Water Quality Commission
